

- Intellectual property rights in the digital era.


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
- E-commerce regulations and electronic transactions.

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The inaugural session of the Post Graduate Diploma program commenced during the academic year of 2021-2022. The Post graduate diploma program in IPR welcomed a cohort of 5 students, while the Post Graduate Diploma program in Cyber Law and Information Technology had a cohort of 5 students.

To pass the Diploma examination a student must obtain 45% of marks in each paper and 50 % in aggregate. Each paper shall be of 100 marks. In addition to that the students are required to submit a project report to be evaluated jointly by the internal and external examiners during practical examination. In the academic year 2021-2022, the pass percentage was recorded at 77.78%, indicating that a significant proportion of students successfully met the requirements to pass their exams.

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
